

Students heed call to conserve energy

As part of a global call to environmental action, youngsters enrolled at the Goddard School are expanding their thinking far be-

yond Middlesex County.

The Goddard School of Old Bridge and the Goddard School of Woodbridge/Iselin are taking part in the World Wildlife Fund's 2009 Earth Hour. On Monday, the schools launched a week of activities and lesson plans designed to increase awareness of how energy use and daily activities can affect the future of the planet and how they can conserve energy in their daily lives. The schools are placing a special focus on how to conserve energy.

The week of activities will lead

up to the schools' "Stepping Up for the Environment" event tomorrow. At 10 a.m., the schools will shut off their lights for an hour, a day before the WWF's Earth Hour. With Earth Hour, the WWF aims to reach more than 1 billion people in 1,000 cities around the world, inviting communities, businesses and governments to switch off lights for one hour at 8:30 p.m. on Saturday.
